What did FA 2015 tell us about student success?

- Fewer enrolled FTF in R1 and R2 categories
- Fewer students on academic probation end of term – across categories
- Slightly more students were dismissed
- More students in good standing with NC grades (risk – off radar)

What did FA 2015 tell us about student success?

Fall 2014/2015

NC Grades (ABC/NC Courses)

- **Fall 2014 - there were 693 degree-seeking undergraduates in Good Standing with NC grades for ABC/NC courses.**
- **Fall 2015 - there were 873 degree-seeking undergraduates in Good Standing with NC grades for ABC/NC courses.**

What did FA 2015 tell us about student success?

- Slightly more students withdrew during Fall term
- Slightly more students were dismissed
- One third of cohort had Math ACT scores below 25
- R3 risk group less engaged, lower GPA
- Math 130 –highest non-completion rate 66.8% (enrolled FTF 401)
- Math 119 – 71.4 % completion rate (enrolled FTF 899)

What did FA 2015 tell us about student success?

Fall 2014/2015

First Time Freshmen Withdrawals During First Fall Semester

- **2014 FTF cohort n= 4701; 43 students withdrew = .92% withdrawal rate**
- **2015 FTF cohort n=4717; 49 students withdrew = 1.04% withdrawal rate**

What did FA 2015 tell us about student success?

Fall 2014/2015

First Time Transfer Withdrawals During First Fall Semester

- **2014 FTT cohort n= 1157; 27 students withdrew = 2.33% withdrawal rate**
- **2015 FTT cohort n=1452; 35 students withdrew = 2.41% withdrawal rate**
